Finally Blessings were read by the other reps (Note we had 7 blessings rather than six for local practical reasons)

ORDER OF SERVICE

Opening Reflection: President Mary McAleese

Call to Prayer

Leader: *Creator God, we gather together in community. We gather as people of conscience and as people of faith. We gather from different corners of Cork and Ireland bringing together the diversity of your people in one place: different cultures, ages, genders, faiths and life experiences. But we gather here in one spirit and with one purpose.*

Mindful of the gift of your life, love and goodness to us, we begin our time together in a spirit of prayer.

LET US PRAY TOGETHER

People: We join our hearts, our spirits and our minds.

Lighting of the Unity Candle by President McAleese

Leader: *After each prayer, as a sign of commitment to bring about change towards integration, a candle is lit. We light six candles for the six faiths present in our community here in Cork. Each candle symbolises a prayer. As the glow from the candle illuminates the service, our prayer is continuous. As the smoke from the candle rises above our reach, our prayers are lifted up to the One who hears and answers.*

*God calls us to show our love for him,
in how we live together in our world and
in the community where we live.*

Muslim Prayer In the name of Allah, the beneficent, the merciful.
Praise be to the Lord of the Universe who has created us,
and made us into tribes and nations,
that we may know each other,
not that we may despise each other.
If the enemy incline towards peace,
do thou also incline towards peace,
and trust God, for the Lord is the one that
heareth and knoweth all things. The servants of God
most gracious are those who walk on the Earth in humility,
and when we address them, we say "PEACE."
God advocates justice, charity,
and the doing of good to others and giving to relatives.
And He forbids evil, vice, and transgression.
He enlightens you, that you may take heed.

People: **We gather in thanksgiving to build a path of hope
and to rejoice in our sharing of the peace and trust
willed by our Creator.**

Leader: *We are entrusted with the responsibility and privilege of building community, as collaborators not competitors, as stewards and life givers, kindling hope and joy as peacemakers living in harmony.*

Jewish Prayer

Come let us go up the mountain of the Lord,

that we may walk the paths of the Most High.
And we shall beat our swords into ploughshares,
and our spears into pruning hooks.
Nation shall not lift up sword against nation,
neither shall they learn war any more.
And none shall be afraid, for the mouth of the
Lord of Hosts has spoken.

People: **May we bring about our Creator's will that all peoples live in peace and harmony.**

Leader: *God, we continue to put our faith in your love
for creation and in your divine justice.
We ask for your peace, which passes all understanding
and we pray that your justice,
which surpasses human imperfection, be done on earth.*

Christian Prayer Lord, make me an instrument of Thy peace;
where there is hatred, let me sow love;
where there is injury, pardon;
where there is doubt, faith;
where there is despair, hope;
where there is darkness, light;
and where there is sadness, joy.
O Divine Master,
grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled
as to console;
to be understood, as to understand;
to be loved, as to love;
for it is in giving that we receive,
it is in pardoning that we are pardoned,
and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

Amen.


Blessing 2: May God bless you with a righteous anger at injustice, oppression and exploitation of people and the earth, so that you will work for justice, equity and peace.
