POPE TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES: "THE CHURCH IS TRULY YOUR HOME"

The Pope's message, released by the Vatican at a press conference on Thursday, has as its theme, "You are my friends" (Jn 15:14). "We are called to be friends of Jesus." the Pope says, adding that this can serve as the spiritual key to accepting the limitations that all of us have, and thus to be at peace with them. This in turn can lead to a joy that "fills hearts and lives." "The Church is truly your home!" the Pope assures people with disabilities. "We, all of us together, are Church, because Jesus chose to be our friend . . . Everyone has a part to play; no one is a mere extra." Hence, "each of you," he says, "is also called to make his or her own contribution to the synodal journey" in "a participative and inclusive ecclesial process."

THE ADVENT SEASON

It is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and to the anniversary of Our Lord's birth on Christmas. From the earliest days of the Church, people have been fascinated by Jesus' promise to come back. But the scripture readings during Advent tell us not to waste our time with predictions. Advent is not about speculation. Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighted down and distracted by the cares of this world (Lk 21:34-36). Like Lent, the liturgical colour for Advent is purple since both are seasons that prepare us for great feast days. Advent also includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting, and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas.
